Oslin rejects TV pilot

Country/pop vocal star K.T. Oslin has pulled out of a starring role in a TV sitcom because "she didn't relate to the character."

Oslin had been signed to make her sitcom debut in Rachel Gunn, R.N.,, a pilot for CBS. Oslin's spokeswoman Evelyn Shriver described Gunn as "so mean."

Add singer K.T. Oslin to the list of country music stars who are moving into TV series.

Oslin has been signed to make her sitcom debut in *Rachel Gunn*, *R.N.*, a pilot for CBS in which the singer plays the "nurse from hell."

Reba McEntire is shooting a TV miniseries, *Gambler IV*, with Kenny Rogers. Dolly Parton has done an NBC movie for fall. Tammy Wynette, who once played in an '80s CBS soap, *Capitol*, plans to play a mom in a troubled family for an NBC pilot, but a recent illness has delayed that.

Oslin, 48, is a consummate late bloomer who landed a recording contract in Nashville after borrowing \$7,000 from an aunt to rent a Nashville club, hire a band and invite the city's movers and shakers.

Last year, Oslin played a rough country gal on CBS' Guns of Paradise. During her struggling years in New York, she was cast as everything from a Puerto Rican dancer in West Side Story to a TV-ad hemorrhoid sufferer. Because she's shooting the pilot now, Oslin has postponed the summer concert trail until mid-July.


